Dear Esteemed Colleagues,

International Institute of Health Management Research (IIHMR) Delhi is proud to welcome you to the '6th National Conference on Tobacco or Health: Towards Tobacco-Free India-An Audacious Race Against Time'

In the first 20 years of this century, globally, tobacco prevalence among adults fell from nearly 33% to 22%. Some 8 million people die each year from tobacco use worldwide. More than 1 million adults die each year in India due to tobacco use accounting for 9.5% of overall deaths. India faces a dual burden of tobacco use in the form of smoking and smokeless tobacco. According to the Global Adult Tobacco Survey (GATS) conducted in 2016–17, the overall prevalence of smoking tobacco use is 10.4% and smokeless tobacco use is 21.4% in India. Of all adults, 28.6% currently consume tobacco either in smoke or smokeless form, including 42.4% of men and 14.2% of women.

The 6th National Conference on Tobacco or Health aims to promote a tobacco-free environment. The conference has been designed to foster discussions and deliberations on essential aspects of tobacco control, including burden of tobacco-related diseases with focus on vulnerable populations, strategies for tobacco harm reduction, and the need for multisectoral coordination for tobacco control. The conference will also highlight the best practices of tobacco control in States and will enable learning through experience sharing by professionals, researchers, academicians, and all others who have been tirelessly working towards tobacco control research, policies, and advocacy. The conference will also provide an opportunity for participants to meet, listen, and interact with distinguished international and national experts. It would be a promising learning opportunity to get valuable insights into the nuances of tobacco control.


